



Patrick Low is a Visiting Professor in the Faculty of Business and Economics at the University of Hong Kong and Director of the AsiaGlobal Fellows Program at the Asia Global Institute. He served as Chief Economist at the World Trade Organization from 1997 to 2013, having previously worked at the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) Secretariat from 1980 to 1987. From 1999 to 2000 he also served as World Trade Organisation (WTO) Director-General Mike Moore's Chief of Staff. He was an Adjunct Professor of International Economics at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies, Geneva, during his tenure as Chief Economist at the WTO. Between leaving the GATT and joining the WTO, Low taught economics at El Colegio de México in Mexico City, from 1987 to 1990, and during this time worked as a consultant for a range of governments and inter-governmental institutions. From 1990 to 1994 he worked as a senior economist in the World Bank's research complex. Low holds a BA and a PhD in Economics (Sussex University), and has written widely on a range of trade policy issues.
